### **General Rules & Information for Exhibitors**

1. Each entry must have been produced or completed between Sept 2021 & Sept 2022
2. Only one entry per category per exhibitor is allowed.
3. Exhibitors NAMES MUST NOT be visible on items
4. Entry tags will be provided by the Colfax Free Fair on Entry Day
5. Exhibitors must complete an entry form - located on last page of information/premium book – to be eligible to enter items. Entry forms will also be available in gym on Entry Day.
6. Exhibits should be good to excellent quality and worthy of awards in order to be competitive.
7. Judges decisions are final.
8. **Exhibit Departments are SEPARATE FOR youth and adults.** Exhibitors must enter items in the correct age group to be eligible for premium payments and ribbon awards.

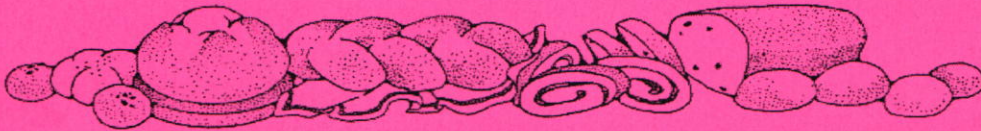

#### **Guidelines**

- 1. Baked goods are judged on appearance, taste & quality.**
- 2. Items must be prepared from scratch – no mixes.**
- 3. Icings/Frosting should NOT include raw eggs, cream cheese, or sour cream that are highly perishable.**
- 4. Refrigerated items NOT accepted**



### Canned Product Guidelines

- 1. Exhibits must be sealed in clean, standard canning jars using two-piece lids.**
- 2. All products must be processed according to recognized safe methods found in the current edition of the *USDA Complete Guide to Home Canning* (available online) or *Ball Blue Book*.**
- 3. All canned foods must be labeled (labels provided on entry day at exhibit hall) with the following information**
  - a. name of product**
  - b. processing method (boiling water canner or pressure canned)**
  - c. length of processing time**
- 4. Product must have been prepared since the most recent fair.**
- 5. To ensure the safety of home-canned foods follow the guidelines from publications noted above or contact Rutherford County Cooperative Extension – 828-287-6020 – to obtain the latest, safest food processing information.**
- 6. Canned products are judged on visible characteristics. Some may be opened for inspection. Notation will be placed on jars which are opened for judging.**
- 7. Dried foods judged on appearance and texture.**

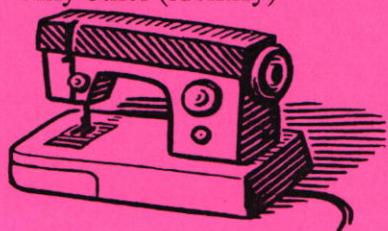

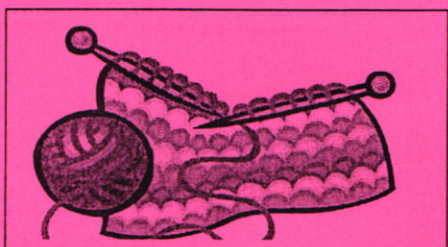
